Course Outline:

On completion of this competency unit; Learners will have the knowledge and application skills to erect and dismantle scaffold structure, assess and evaluate completed scaffolding task. It will also impart learners with the competence to check and maintain scaffolding equipment in compliance with WSH Act, related regulations and organizational safe work procedures

- Identify common hazards and select appropriate PPE related to metal scaffolding work
- Identify scaffold components
- Perform the erection work of frame scaffold system, tubular independent tied scaffold, modular scaffold and tower scaffold
- Perform the dismantling work of scaffold

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Assumed Skills and Knowledge:

Learners must:

Have completed Apply WSH in Process Plant or Perform Work at Height or equivalent

Learners are assumed to:

- Have knowledge of common hazards and necessary safety precautions
- Have the ability to read and interpret electrical drawings, symbols, cable schedules, installation and termination drawings/specifications
- Have knowledge of the methods and skills in the use of common equipment, materials and hand tools appropriate for scaffolding work
- Be physically fit to perform all the required tasks
- Be able to listen, read, speak and write English at a proficiency level equivalent to the Employability Skills System (ESS) level 2
- Be able to manipulate numbers at a proficiency level equivalent to Employability Skills System (ESS) level 2

Certification:

A Statement of Attainment (SOA) will be awarded to successful participants.

Upon successful completion, trainees are eligible for conversion of R2 to R1 skilled worker under MOM enhanced R1 criteria in the process sector with effect from 1st June 2017.

Important note:

Participants are required to bring their personal document (i.e., NRIC, valid Work Permit or In-Principle Approval and Passport), personal protection protective equipment (i.e., Safety helmet, Safety shoes, Safety goggle and Safety gloves) and personal water bottle.
